NOTICE.

In accordance with Society policy, which is to maintain as high a standard of publication as possible, it gives us great pleasure to introduct this Newsletter — the first of a new series.

At the moment we envisage that there will be three/four Newsletters per calendar year.

It is intended to reproduce the Minutes of the General Committee Meetings and the Annual General Meetings, thereby keeping all Members informed of items of policy and the decisions which have been made.

We realise there are many valuable notes, observations and articles, which should appear in print, but which, because of their nature or brevity, cannot be classed as Transactions material. In order that material of this nature is not lost to speleology, we have decided to publish such articles, notes, etc., in the Newsletters. We ask all Members to help us, by submitting anything considered to be of interest. Folk-lore items will be particularly welcome. Contributions should be sent to the Honorary Secretary.

The title-page of this Newsletter is a temporary one, which will be replaced by one incorporating the Society Emblem.

GROUP NEWS.

- 1. HOMORARY MEMBERSHIP. Dr.Arthur Raistrick, M.Sc., F.G.S. We are pleased to announce that Dr.Arthur Raistrick has accepted our invitation to become an Honorary Member of the Society.
- 2. DR.A.RAISTRICK Society Records. At the first A.G.M. of the Society it was passed that in the event of the Society's winding up, the Society "Records" (presumably record files, plans, mine tools, minerals, souvenirs, etc.) should be deposited with a responsible body such as a Museum. At the time, Leeds Central Museum was suggested as a likely place, but no vote was taken regarding this. In consequence, the final resting-place of the Society Records has been discussed and enquired of by members occasionally and in answer to a letter received from Dr.Raistrick, the matter was put to the vote at the Annual General Meeting held on 10th.November 1962. It was passed that the Records should, in the event of the Society's winding up, be deposited in the Craven Huseum, Skipton. We give here a short extract from Dr.Raistrick's letter on the subject:-

"The Craven Museum now has, I believe, the best collection of lead mining material in the North of England and when it is possible to get it out of store and on display, I think the public will be surprised.

Collecting has gone on steadily for the last 40 years and we now have sufficient material to make a selection possible that only the best need be shown. I think the Society is to be congratulated on thinking of this final location for its records. There is no other Museum so close to the mining fields as Skipton."

3. JACK WADDON FUND. The tragic death of Mr.Jack Waddon of the Cave Diving Group, whilst diving at Priddy, will be lamented by his many friends in the Society. He was well liked and respected by all who knew him and as a prominent caver he was well known in the North.

The Cave Diving Group has inaugurated a fund to try to give practical assistance to his wife and two children. Those who feel they would like to contribute to this Fund are asked to note the address to which contributions should be sent:-

4. ANNUAL DINNER 1961/62 SEASON. This was held at the Devonshire Hotel on 10th.November 1962. Mr.W.H.Black of the Keighley News was our chief guest. After the Dinner, films and colour slides were shown by Mr.W.J.Keay.

5. TACKLE REPORT. Mr.A.R.Nichols. Since our last Meet, we have undertaken the renewal of all the Society's equipment. Rope ladders have been dismentled and/or ropes or pegs replaced, using a far superior rope. When completed, we will have 150ft. of renewed rope ladder and approximately 100ft. of the best of last year's ladder. In addition, we have started the production of approximately 150ft. of electron ladder and wire belays. Old lifelines have been scrapped and replaced with 560ft. of superior quality natural fibre rope or 2 x 120 nylon ropes.

As you will see from this, we shall be in a very strong position with regard to equipment. All that is needed to ensure a good year in 1963 is support from members.

Thanks to the kindness of Er.W.M.Stubbs of the Black Horse Hotel, Grassington, the Society has acquired a tackle store and a larger room adjoining it. A Grassington member, Mr.Barry Hodgkinson, has wired the two rooms for electric lighting and a shilling in the slot meter.

It is hoped to use the larger room for various activities, including slide shows and lectures. Members are requested to give their support when details are announced.

Any members wishing to take part in activities, other than meets, are asked to meet at the above-mentioned tackle-room any Sunday between 10 a.m. and 11.a.m.

6. PICKERING END FIELD CENTRE. - 10. NOTES ON SOME OF THE RECENT ADDITIONS TO THE LIBRARY.
- (i) "20 Years Underground in Cuba." This is a book which deals to a large extent with Cave Fauna found by workers in Cuban Caves. Much of this work has been translated from the Spanish by our Honorary Librarian, Mrs.M. Wood and it is hoped to publish part of it at least. Alternatively, those interested should contact Mrs. Wood.
- (ii) "The Discovery of a Notable Curiosity in the Cuba Underground."

 Published in the Review "Cuba." Main article still not translated. This article deals with the discovery in Cuba of growths of stalagmitic form originating from geyser action in the Great Cavern of St. Thomas, situated in the Province of Pinar del Rio, Cuba, which has a total extent of more than 17 kilometres and forms the biggest cavern of Latin America and in actual fact, one of the largest in the world.

Up to the present, only two localities in the world have been reported which present geyser stalagmites. The Cave of Aragonite in Czechoslovakia and the Grand Cavern of St. Thomas in Cuba.

We have to thank Mrs. Wood once again for translating the work and preparing these notes.

- (<u>iii</u>) Our Biological Recorder, Mr.P.S.Schofield, has received some literature from Poland and in addition has had an invitation from the President of the Polish Alpine Club, Speleological Section, to go over and visit some of the caves with a view to seeing the various underground scientific studies which they are carrying out:
- (iv) The Cave Research Group of Great Britain. Publication No.11. Nov.1962.

 "Some Technical Aids for Cave Exploration" by Members of the South Wales
 Caving Club. This is a most remarkable publication and the South Wales
 Caving Club must be congratulated on their effort. It is impossible to
 describe the volume of material contained in this book in a few words. The
 articles include detailed descriptions and methods of manufacture of electron
 and other lightweight tackle; ladder jigs; self-lifelining devices; scaling
 equipment; anti-exposure suits; a magnetic position finding device and finally
 a chapter on the Comparison of Synthetic Ropes suitable for caving. Every
 section is prefusely illustrated and only the most ignorant of persons could
 fail Clubs and in particular we would go so far as to say that every Tackle
 Manager should have a copy for himself.

The Treasurer apologised for not being able to present each Member with a copy of the Balance Sheet.

Mr.Holding said he would be pleased if we could find another Treasurer as he found it exceedingly difficult to carry on with this duty. The Meeting accepted his resignation.

- 3. Honorary Recorder's Report Mr.J.M.Dickinson. Mr.Dickinson stated that Records, Meet Reports and Members' Reports were not coming in as well as last year. Eowever, much progress had been made on the Grassington Moor survey, which was well advanced, some Government-held mining plans of the Greenhow area had been obtained on loan. A large collection of paperwork on the Grimwith Lead Co. had been obtained through Messrs.R. Harker and C.Harker these were now in Records.
- 10 whole-plate photographs, from the Crowther collection of the Keighley News had been obtained by D.Platt for Records. Mr.W.H.Black, the Editor of the Keighley News, had donated these at his own expense for the Society's Records.
- 4. Honorary Secretary's Report Mr.D.Platt. Mr.Platt stated that it had been a good year of progress in many fields: 20 new Members and one Club joined in the year; one Member had resigned. Members had been well received at many Mr.J.Wilcock had presented an illustrated talk to the Cave Research Group Northern Meeting, on the Oxford University Expedition to Northern Spain in 1961.

The Society had put on a one-day Exhibition at Hebden Sports, which was well attended. Mr.C.Wade had, at his own expense, hired the tent which housed the Exhibition.

and large party attended the Derbyshire Congress held again at Buxton, which once more was a most attractive event.

The Field Centre had been moved from Greenhow to the new site at Hebden, thanks to the kindness of Mr.J.Holmes, the tenant farmer.

Permission had been given to lock up and use a trial level for studies in fresh water ecology. Some delay in this project had been encountered due to the Craven Water Board's taking over a nearby level for a public water supply.

- 5. Honorary Librarian's Report Mrs.M.Wood. Very few of the Society books or surveys had been asked for on loan by Members during the year. The Society had several volumes promised by various persons and we await their arrival. The Librarian said she had hoped to produce a Library list during the Society year; this had not materialised, but it would be ready in the near future.
- 6. Honorary Editor's Report Mr.R.T.Clough. Nearly all the articles for the 1962/63 Transactions were to hand. We had had favourable quotations for printing, binding and production of illustrations. The Meeting agreed to leave the matter of the final decision to the Editor and the Editorial Sub-Committee (R.T.Clough; D.Platt; C.Wade; J.M.Dickinson and J.Holden).

Transactions Vol.I.1960/61 had sold well and only an odd copy remained unsold. A very favourable review by Nellie Kirkham had appeared in the Cave Research Group Newsletter No.85 (September 1962). This was read out at the Meeting.

A vote of thanks was proposed to Mr.Clough and all those who had helped to make our past Transactions such an outstanding success.

7. Honorary Biological Recorder's Report - Mr.P.S.Schofield. Mr.Schofield was unable to attend the Meeting - his report had, however, been submitted in writing and was read out by the Honorary Secretary.

Mr. Schofield said he was experiencing difficulty in getting specimens turned round at the British Museum. This was apparently due to work at the Museum. Quite a lot of material had been obtained during the year.

A scheme for a punched card index of known cave fauna was outlined - the Meeting discussed this project but decided to shelve the matter for the time being.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

(i) Letter from Dr.A.Raistrick read at General Committee Meeting 30.9.1962. A letter containing a strong protest by Dr.A.Raistrick against the recommendation by the Committee that, in the case of the disbanding of the Society, the Society Records should be deposited in the Leeds City Reference Library. following proposal was made at the September Meeting by Mr.J.W.Keay:

"That, in the event of our having to dispose of, or deposit, Society Records, we should lodge them at the Craven Museum, Skipton, providing that we were assured by the Museum authorities that Members of the Society should have free access to the Records and should also have the right to withdraw material at any time for display purposes."

As this was a matter for the A.G.M. to decide, the matter was referred to the At the Annual General Meeting Mr.J.Holden seconded the proposal and there was a manimous vote in favour thereof.

9. Any Other Business (continued)

(ii) Dr.A.Raistrick - Honorary Membership. Mr.A.R.Nichols proposed that Dr.A.Raistrick, M.Sc., F.G.S., at present an ordinary Member of the Society, be invited to become an Honorary Member. The proposal was seconded by Mr. D.T.Richardson and there was a unanimous vote in favour.

The Hon. Secretary was instructed to write to Dr. Raistrick on the subject.

- (iii) Leicester University Pothole Club. This organisation had applied for Club Membership of the Society. It was proposed by Mr.J.M.Dickinson and seconded by Mr.R.Leach, that the application be accepted. All were in favour.
- (iv) Annual Dinner. It was pointed out that November was proving a poor choice for the Annual Dinner. Many other Clubs have established the precedence of having their Social functions in November and for that matter, December and January. As it has always been the policy of this Society to hold its Annual General Meeting and Annual Dinner on the same day, the question arose as to whether or not we should split these events in the future.
- Mr.D.T.Richardson said that in his opinion, the question resolved itself into altering the date of the end of the Society's financial year, thus allowing us to continue having the A.G.M. and Dinner on the same day and at the same time giving Society officials time to prepare their reports etc. for the A.G.M. To further this end, Mr.Richardson proposed that the Society's financial year should end on the 30th.September. This proposal was seconded by Mr.M.Roxburgh and all were in favour. The Hon.Secretary was given authority to make the necessary alterations in the Society Constitution.
- (\underline{v}) Annual General Meeting & Annual Dinner. The Meeting agreed that, in future, these functions be held on the last Saturday in October.
- (vi) Dance. No decision had been reached by the Sub-Committee on this matter the business was, therefore, left over for re-consideration.
- (vii) Tackle Sub-Committee. Mr.D.Platt proposed that Mr.Roy Leach be appointed in place of Mr.J.Sletcher. Mr.A.R.Nichols seconded this proposal and all were in favour. The Tackle Sub-Committee, therefore, comprises: Messrs.A.R.Nichols, W.Emmott, K.Foster and R.Leach.
- (viii)Library. Mr.D.T.Richardson asked if it would be possible for us to have the various booklets, etc. belonging to the Library bound between stout covers in order to preserve them. He pointed out that many of the publications received or purchased by the Society were in fact irreplaceable and went out of print the minute they were issued. The Meeting decided that, in view of our financial commitments for the new Transactions, we could not at the moment invest in such a project. It was agreed that the idea was a sound one which should not be overlooked.
- 10. As there was no further business to discuss, the Chairman declared the Meeting closed.
